I write to you this month of May and as we are approaching the dog days of summer encircled with the idea that it is still the Easter season at the beginning of this month. The Easter season as I've shared is the ultimate season for us in the church. For without it, we may not be who we are today. It culminates with the journey of Jesus into Jerusalem to offer himself up as a sacrifice to the cross, to be crucified and then buried, and then 3 days later he is Risen. The journey for each of us is symbolic in the Easter story for in that story lays the idea of the New Life given through the journey.

Journeys for many of us become personal or sometimes out of the blue depending on what comes our way. Recently, the journey with Dawn and I went to Englewood Florida where we spent time with her mother on the water but also saw some of the destruction that was left from the previous hurricane the year before. In some instances, I saw the new life forging ahead with a rebuilt nature and a moving forward approach, and in other instances I still saw the aftermath of what was not prepared or fixed from the storm. It's fitting to see both new life and what is life but not as we know it become ever present in our focus and understanding of what our relationship with God endures. It would be so simple for us to sit back and let the world go by and for everything to be perfect within our realm here on earth. But we know better. We know there are times when life gives us a curveball, with health, a situation that becomes troublesome, doubts that may arise, maybe even a confidence along the way that we begin to question. The resurrection story reminds us to stay the course no matter what because it defines for us who we will be the next day. Recently, I completed all 8 steps for my marks of ministry for ordination and will be beginning this month a long paper of ordination to be submitted to my peers for evaluation and defending said paper. This too has been a journey for me and the church. It has seen uphill struggles (Covid, tornado relief, etc..) as well as triumphs see the above along the way. As I stand here before you today, I feel a sense of empowerment in knowing we are all on this journey together in becoming more faithful in the

idea of the Resurrection and Easter story, for we are the Easter people in living our lives in serving others with our love, compassion and understanding that we represent God's own son in the world and embody his journey to the cross in faithful ways of our interactions with others around us in building God's kingdom here on earth. Let us embrace each opportunity to come our way in "Living the Word, by Serving the World" in our speech, in our spirituality and the way we connect with one another especially to those we serve in a more faithful way and to share in the gift of the new life given in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ our Lord. To all of you may we be faithful in this journey with one another.


